

Documentation and Reporting Status Codes

DOCUMENTATION TIPS

Assessment and reporting of chronic conditions includes applicable status codes to support the patient's severity of illness. Status codes identify current and historical conditions that may affect the patient's current and future health status.

Report all documented conditions that coexist at the time of the visit and require or affect patient care, treatment or management.¹

ICD-10-CM Code	Description	Instructions
Z21	Asymptomatic human immunodeficiency virus (HIV)	Report for HIV positive patients without an AIDS-related illness.
Z79.4	Long term (current) use of insulin	Report for patients with diabetes in categories E08, E09, E11, E13; who are being treated with insulin. Do not report for patients with Type 1 diabetes.
Z89.-	Acquired absence of toe(s), foot, ankle or leg	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identify site and laterality. AKA or BKA are acceptable acronyms for above the knee or below the knee amputation. Amputation can be from a traumatic incident or secondary to a chronic condition.
Z93.-	Artificial opening status	Identify the site – tracheostomy, ileostomy, colostomy, cystostomy
Z94.-	Transplanted organ and tissue status	Identify the specific organ (heart, lung, liver, pancreas, intestine, bone marrow, etc.)
Z99.11	Dependence on a respirator (ventilator) status	Document the specific diagnosis for which the patient is on a respirator or other mechanical ventilation.
Z99.15	Patient's non-compliance with renal dialysis	Document non-compliance when the patient refuses dialysis, misses appointments, etc.
Z99.2	Dependence on renal dialysis	Document the frequency of dialysis.
Z99.81	Dependence on supplemental oxygen	Document and report the underlying condition for which the patient is on long-term oxygen.

DOCUMENTATION AND REPORTING EXAMPLE

Patient with BKA of left leg due to PVD. Stump is clean, no sores or irritation.

I73.9 Peripheral vascular disease

Z89.512 Acquired absence of left leg below knee

According to the ICD-10-CM Official Guidelines for Coding and Reporting FY 2022: “A dash (-) at the end of an alphabetic index entry indicates that additional characters are required.” Refer to the tabular to verify that all characters are assigned to complete the diagnosis code.
